We would like to introduce you to Isabella King and her family. There is no simple way to explain to you what happened to Isabella other than please read the following extract -

"On the 8th of October, 2009 six year old Isabella Aroa King was attacked by a dog in a neighbour's back yard. The attack resulted in about 70% of Isabella's scalp being torn off in two pieces, a large laceration on her right shoulder approximately 8cm x 4cm, puncture wounds to the front of the shoulder, lacerations and puncture wounds to her left elbow and the loss of a primary front tooth.

That night the royal Flying Doctors Service flew Isabella directly to Brisbane for immediate treatment at the Royal Brisbane Children's Hospital. Isabella underwent eight hours of surgery in an attempt to re-attach the two portions of her scalp that was severed in the attack. Unfortunately around 25% of the scalp was unable to be saved due to the extreme damage that was sustained. This was substituted with skin grafts. Isabella has now received skin grafts covering this portion of her scalp which have taken very well. She has just returned to Weipa for eight weeks rest before returning to Brisbane again for multiple surgeries which at this stage will include attempting to stretch her remaining portion of scalp to give her more hair coverage.

It is difficult to put into words the gratitude that the family have for the support received from family, friends and the Weipa community as a whole. It is times like these that you begin to realise the importance of friendship and close community spirit."

Just4Kids are going to have a wonderful time in Weipa in August 2010 and the main purpose of us being there is to support the Isabella King Trust Fund. We will hold a community dinner/function at the Albatross Hotel on Sunday 22nd and a fishing fundraising day on the Monday. Our good friend Nuggett, from the 4BC Fishing Show will be there along with Terri Garlick from the Weipa Bait and Tackle Shop. Terri has organized the Weipa fishing fraternity to take a flotilla of boats out fishing and all funds raised will go towards Isabella's ongoing medical and travel expenses.

Restorative Parent/Carer Retreat on 11-13 September 2009

Thirteen children with a significant disability benefitted greatly from the Carers Retreat – their parents are now refreshed and less stressed, linked with a network of understanding friends, and empowered with strategies to combat stress. Many also had the opportunity to have fun in a park (which is very rare or not possible due to the family circumstances). The photos say it allthis was a great weekend (generously funded by sponsors of Just 4 Kids), which culminated in a family get-together in the park, with 3 of the motor trail cars on display (a big "thank you" to Shirley and Tony, Mark & Tammy and Keith and Di who were also able to "show the flag" for Just4Kids Motor Trail)

The event—Organised and facilitated by staff from Dept of Communities (Disability Services), with volunteers (Judy Shardlow adding a depth of caring with many positive and inspiring messages and a listening ear, and Deb Pettigrew, lending her expertise to give parents the experience of creating an artistic masterpiece in a short period of time)

Fourteen parents (three couples, one Dad and seven Mums were able to get away for the break (from Friday afternoon to midday Sunday), with some tears shed as they shared their stories, and bonded strongly. They were able to participate in activities such as Relaxation Pilates, Landscape painting, Life Balance Stress Management, massage, walking, talking and having their own space.

The benefits—These parents (some with several children with a significant disability) were universally positive in their feedback. The following are indications that this was a very worthwhile cause with positive results:

Thank you so much for recognizing the need for us to relax and leave worry and responsibility behind for a few days. It has been very restorative"

"A weekend away I would have never got around to myself. Thank you so much for the opportunity to focus on myself. I'm sure both (son) and (husband) will appreciate the more relaxed Mum"

"Thank you doesn't nearly describe the way we feel for the opportunity to get away and meet so many new people to talk to, but thank you for the time you took to help us have such a wonderful time"
