



EMERGENCY PROCEDURES

While this section is mainly about road accidents and the procedures to follow in the event of a road accident, the basic principles should be followed for any emergency during a Just4Kids event.

Firstly, and most importantly, make sure an official knows about the emergency. While this may seem like something of little importance, it is most important for insurance reasons, an official must be advised of any emergency, immediately. This should be done either by mobile phone or on the UHF.

The first official to hear of an emergency has an immediate responsibility of notifying the Motor Trail Director and other officials.

AT THE SCENE

- Note the time of accident and vehicle involved.
- Notified an official
- Ensure the scene is safe.
- Delegate people to control & stop/slowdown traffic.
- Notify other entrants on our UHF channel
- Standby with a fire extinguisher
- Check stability of vehicle
- Check the occupant's condition
- Assist occupants if vehicle stable
- If vehicle unstable, wait for recovery crew

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NOTIFY OFFICIALS

- Notify officials of situation & your location
- Notify Car Number, number of occupants
- Notify number of injured occupants & type of injuries
- Notify if any trapped in vehicle
- Notify if ambulance or doctor required

CALLING THE EMERGENCY SERVICES

- An official to notify ambulance or police
- If not practical, you may call them
- Identify your location - sign post, road or track, house number or grid position on your GPS
- Notify emergency services of number of vehicles & people involved
- Notify them of type of injuries, if they are trapped etc.
- Distance bystanders, keep accident scene free of onlookers

GIVING OUT INFORMATION

- Accident details only given to Police or Ambulance personal.
- No details to be given to Media or Tow Truck drivers
- Witnesses to inform Motor Trail Officials only/Police
